2009-2010 TUITION PLANS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS (I-20 Visa required)

Tuition rates for Grades 7 through 12

\$7,000.00 per student (includes I-20 visa)

A non-refundable down payment of \$100.00 for each student is due on or before May 8, 2009.

***** SMART registration is necessary for all families. If you are new to the plan or wish to pay tuition in full, you must complete a SMART tuition payment plan form. If paying tuition in full by June 26, 2009, you may deduct your \$43.00 SMART fee and the \$100.00 registration down payment from the total amount of tuition due and your registration will not be sent to SMART. If not paid in full by June 26, 2009, you will be registered with the SMART plan.**

****You will not receive a tuition statement from York Catholic; please call to verify amount due if paying in full. Thank you.**

According to the policy established by the school board, no transcripts will be forwarded, no diplomas issued, nor will academic reports be given unless all tuition and fees are current or paid in full.

York Catholic is operated as a faith community, and not as a commercial or secular enterprise. The school provides an opportunity for the development of faith-based values and for receiving instruction in the Gospel of Christ as part of its religious mission and ministry. Consequently, the payment of tuition may not be considered as creating a commercial or contractual relationship between the school and the parents that may be construed to create a legally enforceable obligation on the part of the school, or its sponsoring ecclesiastical entities, to allow for continued enrollment, or to provide any type or level of educational services, or to provide such services involuntarily.
